We are centered on the character and the teachings of Christ with the intentions of modeling out the Great Commission.




Sustainable

The Evangelism Department is spreading the love of God in tangible ways throughout several villages around Bulike and Buluya. Since the restrictions put in place during the Covid-19 lockdowns have largely been lifted, this department has turned its attention to reaching out to more people and hosting large scale events for the community. It is wonderful to see the Lord work through these mighty leaders, and we are seeing people's lives change.

Highlights

Churches are hosting large scale evangelism events, overnight prayer, and times of prayer and fasting. These activities are bringing HOPE.

We are working on structures for several of the church groups.

The youth are actively involved in the churches and community through six youth groups.

Water is a vital and immediate need in rural villages. Water Well Technicians have been on the move preparing to bring water wells to neighboring villages that do not have access to safe water.

Crops have been growing consistently and are more resistant to drought due to new irrigation systems. This change has helped many people earn reliable incomes in agriculture. Water-related diseases and deaths continue to decrease, and hygiene and health across the community is improving.

Highlights

Our Water Well Technicians visited 12 new neighboring villages to plan out possible sites for new wells.

Equipment provided by the generous congregation at Christ Church Sugar Land is in route and will fix the parts of the drilling equipment that have been causing issues.

We conducted various small groups at water wells with over 97 people in attendance.

Our schools have been impacting communities by providing students opportunities to receive an education, develop positive personal habits, and learn about the love of God for over a decade. We are very happy to announce that students across all four of our education programs have returned to campus. Teachers and staff are excited to see their smiling faces and participate in campus activities again.

Campuses have undergone several updating and construction projects during this period, and there are many more planned for the near future. We have seen literacy rates increase for both the students and their parents, and it is evident that God is changing lives through these schools.

Highlights

In-person learning started back in full session on January 10th. Efforts are underway to get all students back to school.



School's new toilet facility is complete.

We completed necessary updates to the classroom, which included plastering the schoolhouses and putting up walls to divide rooms.



Staff and students are participating in projects to help fund the school. They are raising goats and a cow, growing banana plants, and making clay bricks as income-producing activities.







Nana Health Center and its subsidiary, Buluya Dispensary, deliver high quality health care services and improve the health and well-being of residents in the communities in which we serve.

Both the Nana Health Center and the Bulike Dispensary have been active and busy during this period. A new motorbike ambulance has helped expand services and spread health awareness throughout a broader community creating positive health impacts in the surrounding villages.

Highlights

The medical staff dormitory building is about 90% complete and construction is ongoing until it is finished. This will give the medical staff, who have to traverse long distances to work at the clinics, a safe place to stay while they are on duty.

The medical staff has been consistently conducting home visits to follow-up with health problems and educate families on hygiene and healthy practices.

The new ambulance is helping bring more people into the clinics and take additional health services to new areas.

Number of Villages Covered: 20 Counseling has been taking place at the Nana Health Center and is available to all age groups. Outreach programs covering about ten villages were conducted to meet people where they are. Besides the services at the Nana Health Center, we offer care at the secondary school, primary school, churches, in homes, and throughout three communities and multiple villages including Nawaikoke, Buyende, Bulike, and Buluya.

Highlights

The first installment was made to purchase land to relocate the corn mills which generate revenue to sustain this department of UCSS.

Mental Health Facilitators are now covering more villages and reaching out to new areas.

We continue to train new facilitators in order to provide services to an expanding client base.

"We've been involved in lots of ministries and lots of missions overseas and UCSS has the right philosophy. We love their idea of helping without hurting. You're helping people along the communities, spiritually, physically, medically- you're

This year the agricultural groups have focused on development and training in order to achieve the following objectives: to improve the farm food production, promote farmers' cooperative spirit, increase savings and income producing activities, improve the tree coverage on our farms, maintain the farms, bring irrigation systems to all UCSS farms, and work hand-in-hand with the community.

Highlights

Maintained farm plots by clearing, weeding, and distributing pesticides.

Cleared and weeded farm land to get ready for the planting season and rainy season.

We saw an increase in the number of community members who joined us to work on the farms.

Leaders conducted outreaches to other farmers in the community, and several gave their lives to Christ and joined Bible studies.

The Economic Development Department continues to be instrumental in giving people the skills they need to produce an income. Not only does this help the economic status of the community, but it also creates a culture of productivity, purpose, and cooperation. These groups have various focuses including agriculture and farming, business associations, craft making, and tailoring. They are helping communities become self-sufficient and productive.

Highlights

The economic co-op groups met together to plan and strategize.

Bible studies that were hosted by the economic groups had good attendance.

Group members have been participating in financial literacy training which teaches the value of saving money and using it responsibly.

Several young adult students started training at our vocational school and are learning new skills like tailoring.

They do an incredible job lifting up these communities with just the smallest of resources and everything is just used so well. It's just a wonderful ministry to be involved with."


