Medical Care



At Nana Health Center, our mission goes beyond providing medical care. Our unyielding dedication to our clients' well-being has led us to develop groundbreaking milestones in areas of holistic transformation, continuous healing, community empowerment, sustainability, and spiritual growth.

We are offering several in and outpatient services including maternal and child health services, HIV testing and counseling, and ultrasound scans, which have enabled us to reach the wider community to offer more services.

But **6,688** patients are receiving medical services from both Nana Health Center and Buluya Dispensary.

We also received funds to help conduct Ebola training for the community health workers of lkumbya and Bukooma.

We sent one staffer to study sonography. We also have a new midwife, laboratory assistant and volunteer midwife. This has reduced client wait times.

Counseling



Over the past several years, there has been a notable increase in the demand for mental health services. reflecting the growing awareness of the importance of emotional and behavioral well-being. Our dedicated team of Mental Health Facilitators (MHFs) has not only met the rising demand for care but demonstrated an unwavering commitment to providing exceptional care, collaborating with various departments, and engaging with communities to ensure the delivery of the best possible mental health services.

8,452 PEOPLE HAVE RECEIVED COUNSELING THIS YEAR

We now have a stationed field counselor which has improved the quality of service provided.

WE ARE REACHING NEW COMMUNITIES!

We are now serving three districts: Luuka, Buyende, and Kaliro.

WE ARE TRAINING, GROWING, AND LEADING!

We successfully conducted an MHF training program. Each UCSS department has a focal MHF person, as well as one in the communities we are covering.

Clean Water



In a world where the availability of clean and safe water is paramount, our department stands as a beacon of dedication and innovation. With an unwavering commitment to ensuring access to pristine water resources for all, we tirelessly work to safeguard the wellbeing of both our communities and our environment.

IT TAKES A VILLAGE

Several committee members are being elected in the community to help manage the wells and host educational and informational meetings.

ADDITIONAL RESOURCES

We were able to hire a plumber to help keep the wells operational. We also received a motorcycle that helps us reach out to the community and check on the wells.

DRILL, BABY, DRILL!

95 water wells have been completed. We thank God for the drilling machine and compressor to ensure drilling continues. 11 new sites have been drilled, and we have educated 123 communities about hygiene and sanitation at water wells

Agriculture



In the arid heartlands where the earth once cracked and hope seemed to wither away, a remarkable story of rejuvenation and resilience is unfolding. FEEDING FAMILIES & PLANTING TREES

862 families have received food grown on UCSS farms.

9,682 trees have been planted this year bringing the grand total to 143,003 trees planted by UCSS.

JOB CREATION

249 community members are now employed on one of 14 UCSS farms

EDUCATION IS KEY TO GROWTH

UCSS conducted 16 trainings to educate community farmers on modern farming techniques. 460 people attended those trainings.

Economic Development



The story we share is about a rebirth of hope, a rekindling of traditions, and a testament to what can be achieved when people stand united against the odds with one goal of economic empowerment. We tell the story of a community that decided to break the cycle of poverty. Tailoring, jewelry making, farming, and banking groups have transformed the lives of many in our communities.

THE VOCATIONAL INSTITUTE IS EXPANDING

We currently have 26 students enrolled. Four instructors were added to the team to improve and increase the range of skills being given, and once finished with the program, students take part in a graduation ceremony.


TANGIBLE SKILLS

The tailoring/sewing class made **132** uniforms. There are currently **15** ongoing household projects.

THERE ARE 89 ECONOMIC GROUPS

These groups are actively saving and participating in SACCO activities and we have an average of **150** people attending financial literacy sessions monthly.


