### **Agriculture**

In the arid heartlands where the earth once cracked and hope seemed to wither away, a remarkable story of rejuvenation and resilience unfolds. Our unwavering commitment to community involvement, sustainability, and the relentless pursuit of nourishing a better tomorrow cultivates a future of abundance for our communities.

### **WIDESPREAD IMPACT**

UCSS conducted 16 trainings on modern farming. We now have 14 model farms, and 1673 families benefit from food grown on those farms.

# Drilling machines and a compressor made the new water wells happen. We have also incorporated 106 homes into the wash program.


# 150 COMMUNITIES LEARN ABOUT SUSTAINABILITY

# TRANSPORTATION LEADS TO EFFICIENCY

Our new motorcycle enables the UCSS clean water ambassadors to travel throughout the region more quickly and efficiently.

- Extend the clean water network to Nakalama, Cornerstone Vocational, and Nabisiki

### **Counseling**

Our Mental Health Facilitators (MHFs) are a dedicated team who believe in taking care of the whole person. We provide a wide range of services and support to our clients. We continually offer opportunities to bring new MHFs on the team and offer trainings to enable us to address the root issues that harm families, individuals and the community to help people make healthier choices.

#### **DEDICATED STAFF**

Each UCSS department now has a dedicated MHF. We work closely with schools to offer guidance, and many children have returned to school after dropping out.

### REACHING NEW COMMUNITIES!

We are now serving three districts: Luuka, Buyende, and Kaliro. We also partner with stakeholders including police stations, hospitals, government agencies, and the students' ambassador program.

# TRANSPORTATION DEVELOPMENTS

We now have 10 bicycles for our mental health facilitators. That access to transportation enables them to operate more efficiently and reach more areas throughout the community.

### **Change Story**

Meet Isaac (not his real name), a student from our Community-Based Schools. He had dropped out of school when his parents decided that chores at home were more important than attending school.

A village child protection unit whistleblower alerted the resident Mental Health Facilitator (MHF), who reached out to the family to offer counseling and communicate the importance of getting a good education. Following the counseling session, the boy was admitted to a boarding school away from home, where he could focus on his education.



# Economic Development

The story we share is about a rebirth of hope, a rekindling of traditions, and a testament to what can be achieved when people stand united against the odds with one goal: economic empowerment. We tell the story of a community that decided to break the cycle of poverty.

# 15 HOUSEHOLD PROJECTS

We currently have ongoing household projects. UCSS is also conducting outreach in order to mobilize resources and identify new potential groups.

# WE HAVE ADDED ADDITIONAL VOCATIONAL SKILLS

UCSS conducts crop husbandry and poultry management training sessions to equip members with modernized Poultry Management Skills and techniques.

# THERE ARE 89 ECONOMIC GROUPS

These groups also see an average of 150 people attending financial literacy sessions monthly.

UCSS was able to purchase solar lights for Nakalama Christian Community Primary School. This allows our students to be able to study at night. It is also provides for a safer environment.






#### SUCCESS STORY

Jovia had been out of school for two years. By the time UCSS met her in 2023, it was too late for her to register. Jovia is now a student at Bulike Christian Community School in primary seven. Like Jovia we have encouraged many young girls and boys to reregister in school or to join us for trade schooling or skilled programs to learn skills that will help them earn a living.

- Complete dorm construction at Nakalama, Bulike CCPS and Liberty CCHS
- Build a water well at Nakalama CCPS
- Purchase furniture and textbooks for students at Nabisiki CCPS
- Construct staff housing and a nursery wing
- Engage in more extracurricular activities
- Build proper kitchens at each school
- Construct a library and lab at the high school
- Hire more instructors





### **Education**

Our schools have expanded their reach and influence. At Bulike Christian Community Primary School (BCCPS) we have 671 learners, 598 at Nakalama Christain Community Primary School (NCCPS), 225 students at Nabisiki CCPS, 284 at Liberty Christain Community High School (LCCHS), and 24 learners at Cornerstone Vacational

# OUR SCHOOLS ARE GROWING!

We have **160** new students at Bulike Christian Community Primary School (BCCPS), **256** new students at Nakalama Christian Community Primary School (NCCPS), and **111** new students at Liberty Christian Community High School (LCCHS).

#### **BEYOND BOOKS**

Our students are learning tangible skills that include tailoring, book making, soap making, baking, and crafts. Trade skills lead to transformation and economic mobility.

Students are able to earn money putting their new skills to work!

### STUDENTS AND STAFF ARE GETTING COUNSELING

We have strengthened counseling sessions for students and staff at the school. Counselors are helping give people the skills and habits essential for health, employment, personal development, and self-sufficiency.

### **EXTRACURRICULAR SUCCESS**

Bulike Christian Community Primary School students competed in athletic competitions at Ikumbya Primary School. Four of our students were selected among the best and elevated to the district level.

#### **SECURTY & PRIVACY ENHANCEMENT**

The Liberty Christian Community
High School as well as the girls'
dormitory is now fully fenced in.
This provides an added layer of
security, privacy, and peace of mind
for the students and parents alike.







# **Evangelism**

4,840 people are attending church services at one of our nineteen churches!

Uganda vibrates with the transformative power of God's love. New converts, empowered leaders, and flourishing communities paint a vivid picture of the gospel's impact. From spiritual growth to tangible development, the Lord's work strengthens individuals and families across generations.

### 4,840 AVERAGE ATTENDANCE AT 19 CHURCHES

More than **500** students attend Sunday school services and **36** missional bible study communities have been established. Permanent church structures in Bulike, Nabisike, and Kwanga are under construction.

### **Medical Care**

Nana Health Center has emerged as an epicenter of sustainable solutions to community health challenges bringing forth innovative solutions, treating diseases, and raising health awareness. This has led to thriving communities with an awakened desire to live healthier lives.

# FULL TIME DOCTOR, FULL TIME HEALTHCARE

UCSS hired a full time medical doctor and established cervical cancer screenings. We also purchased a blood bank refrigerator for blood storage and are now able to perform blood transfusions.

# INCREASING OUR OUTREACH

Our health workers conducted integrated outreaches at Bulike Primary School, Bukoobo Primary School, Bukoobo Lutheran Primary School, and Sunrise Primary

### NAKALAMA CLINIC & NANA EXTENSION


50,000 bricks were made to construct the Nana extension and Nakalama clinic. We also renovated the Nana Health Center. We completed registration for the Buluya Clinic.
